A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Maryland Fair Scheduling Act**

3 FOR the purpose of requiring a certain employer, except under certain circumstances, to
4 pay certain employees at a certain rate for certain shifts; providing that a shift trade
5 includes when the employer transmits the shift trade offer under certain
6 circumstances; providing for the application of certain provisions of this Act;
7 providing that an employee has the right to decline certain work hours that occur
8 during a certain number of hours following the end of a shift; requiring an employer
9 to pay a certain employee who agrees to work certain hours at a certain rate;
10 requiring each employer to record certain wages in a certain statement of earnings
11 and specify in the statement certain predictability pay; authorizing the
12 Commissioner of Labor and Industry, under certain circumstances, to require an
13 employer to include certain information in a certain statement and use additional
14 means to notify the employer's employees of certain information; requiring an
15 employer to give employees notice of certain rights in a certain manner; requiring
16 employers to keep certain records for a certain minimum period of time and make
17 the records available for inspection by certain individuals; providing that each day
18 an employer violates a certain provision of this Act is a separate violation;
19 prohibiting certain persons from taking certain actions; providing that certain
20 protections apply to certain employees; providing for the enforcement of this Act;
21 requiring the Commissioner to keep a certain identity confidential, except under
22 certain circumstances, and to notify a certain person before a certain disclosure is
23 made; requiring the Commissioner to post certain information on a certain Web site
24 on or before a certain date each year; authorizing the Commissioner to conduct a
25 certain investigation under certain circumstances; providing for the construction of
26 this Act; requiring the Commissioner to enforce this Act; authorizing the
27 Commissioner to adopt certain regulations; providing for a delayed effective date;
28 defining certain terms; and generally relating to fair scheduling.

11 (A) **IN THIS SUBTITLE THE FOLLOWING WORDS HAVE THE MEANINGS**
12 **INDICATED.**

13 (B) **"EMPLOYEE" DOES NOT INCLUDE:**

14 (1) **AN INDIVIDUAL WHO IS EXEMPT FROM THE MINIMUM WAGE AND**
15 **OVERTIME PROVISIONS OF THE FEDERAL FAIR LABOR STANDARDS ACT; OR**

16 (2) **AN INDIVIDUAL WHO PERFORMS WORK FOR AN EMPLOYER FOR**
17 **REMUNERATION IF:**

18 (I) **THE INDIVIDUAL IS FREE FROM THE EMPLOYER'S CONTROL**
19 **AND DIRECTION REGARDING THE PERFORMANCE OF THE WORK;**

20 (II) **THE INDIVIDUAL CUSTOMARILY IS ENGAGED IN AN**
21 **INDEPENDENT BUSINESS OR OCCUPATION OF THE SAME NATURE AS THAT INVOLVED**
22 **IN THE WORK; AND**

23 (III) **THE WORK IS:**

24 1. **OUTSIDE THE USUAL COURSE OF BUSINESS OF THE**
25 **EMPLOYER; OR**

26 2. **PERFORMED OUTSIDE ANY PLACE OF BUSINESS OF**
27 **THE EMPLOYER.**

1 (C) "EMPLOYER" MEANS A PERSON THAT EMPLOYS INDIVIDUALS IN A FOOD
2 SERVICES ESTABLISHMENT OR RETAIL ESTABLISHMENT.

3 (D) "FOOD SERVICES ESTABLISHMENT" MEANS AN ENTITY THAT IS A
4 FULL-SERVICE OR LIMITED-SERVICE RESTAURANT, AS DEFINED UNDER THE
5 NORTH AMERICAN INDUSTRY CLASSIFICATION SYSTEM, NAICS 7221 AND NAICS
6 7222, IF THE RESTAURANT IS:

7 (1) PART OF A CHAIN OF AT LEAST 10 RESTAURANTS NATIONWIDE; OR

8 (2) A FRANCHISE OF AT LEAST 10 ESTABLISHMENTS NATIONWIDE,
9 INCLUDING:

10 (I) AN INTEGRATED ENTERPRISE THAT OWNS OR OPERATES AT
11 LEAST 10 ESTABLISHMENTS IN THE AGGREGATE NATIONALLY; OR

12 (II) AN ESTABLISHMENT OPERATED IN ACCORDANCE WITH A
13 FRANCHISE AGREEMENT WHERE THE FRANCHISOR AND THE FRANCHISEE OWN OR
14 OPERATE AT LEAST 10 ESTABLISHMENTS IN THE AGGREGATE NATIONALLY.

15 (E) "ON-CALL SHIFT" MEANS TIME THAT AN EMPLOYER REQUIRES AN
16 EMPLOYEE TO BE AVAILABLE TO WORK AND TO CONTACT THE EMPLOYER OR THE
17 EMPLOYER'S DESIGNEE, OR TO WAIT TO BE CONTACTED BY THE EMPLOYER OR THE
18 EMPLOYER'S DESIGNEE, WITHIN 24 HOURS OF THE START OF A POTENTIAL SHIFT TO
19 DETERMINE WHETHER THE EMPLOYEE MUST REPORT TO WORK.

20 (F) "RETAIL ESTABLISHMENT" MEANS A BUSINESS WHERE GOODS ARE
21 SOLD ON THE PREMISES AT RETAIL AND THAT IS A PART OF A CHAIN OF AT LEAST 10
22 RETAIL ESTABLISHMENTS NATIONWIDE.

23 (G) "SHIFT" MEANS THE CONSECUTIVE HOURS AN EMPLOYER REQUIRES AN
24 EMPLOYEE TO WORK OR TO BE ON CALL TO WORK.

25 3-1302.

26 THIS SUBTITLE MAY NOT BE CONSTRUED TO:

27 (1) DISCOURAGE OR PROHIBIT AN EMPLOYER FROM THE ADOPTION
28 OR RETENTION OF POLICIES THAT ARE MORE BENEFICIAL TO EMPLOYEES THAN THE
29 REQUIREMENTS OF THIS SUBTITLE;

30 (2) DIMINISH THE OBLIGATION OF AN EMPLOYER TO COMPLY WITH A
31 CONTRACT, A COLLECTIVE BARGAINING AGREEMENT, AN EMPLOYMENT BENEFIT

1 PLAN, OR ANY OTHER AGREEMENT THAT ESTABLISHES POLICIES THAT ARE MORE
2 BENEFICIAL TO AN EMPLOYEE THAN THE REQUIREMENTS OF THIS SUBTITLE; OR

3 (3) PREEMPT, LIMIT, OR OTHERWISE AFFECT THE APPLICABILITY OF
4 ANY OTHER LAW, POLICY, OR STANDARD ESTABLISHING SCHEDULING POLICIES
5 THAT PROVIDE ADDITIONAL RIGHTS OR EXTEND OTHER PROTECTIONS TO
6 EMPLOYEES BEYOND THOSE PROVIDED UNDER THIS SUBTITLE.

8 (A) (1) EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SUBSECTIONS (C) AND (E) OF THIS
9 SECTION AND PARAGRAPH (2) OF THIS SUBSECTION, AN EMPLOYER SHALL PAY AN
10 EMPLOYEE FOR AT LEAST 4 HOURS AT THE EMPLOYEE'S REGULAR RATE OF PAY FOR
11 EACH SHIFT OR ON-CALL SHIFT FOR WHICH THE EMPLOYEE REPORTS TO WORK, AS
12 REQUIRED BY THE EMPLOYER, BUT IS REQUIRED TO WORK LESS THAN 4 HOURS.

13 (2) EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SUBSECTIONS (C) AND (E) OF THIS
14 SECTION, IF THE EMPLOYEE'S SCHEDULED HOURS ARE LESS THAN 4 HOURS, THE
15 EMPLOYER SHALL PAY THE EMPLOYEE FOR THE SCHEDULED HOURS OF THE
16 EMPLOYEE FOR THAT DAY IF THE EMPLOYEE REPORTS TO WORK, AS REQUIRED BY
17 THE EMPLOYER, BUT IS GIVEN LESS THAN THE SCHEDULED HOURS OF WORK.

18 (B) EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SUBSECTIONS (C) AND (E) OF THIS SECTION, IF
19 AN EMPLOYER REQUIRES AN EMPLOYEE TO BE AVAILABLE FOR AN ON-CALL SHIFT
20 BUT DOES NOT REQUIRE THE EMPLOYEE TO REPORT TO WORK, THE EMPLOYER
21 SHALL PAY THE EMPLOYEE:

22 (1) 2 HOURS OF PAY AT THE EMPLOYEE'S REGULAR HOURLY RATE
23 FOR EACH ON-CALL SHIFT OF 4 HOURS OR LESS; AND

24 (2) 4 HOURS OF PAY AT THE EMPLOYEE'S REGULAR HOURLY RATE
25 FOR EACH ON-CALL SHIFT EXCEEDING 4 HOURS.

26 (C) AN EMPLOYER IS NOT REQUIRED TO PAY THE WAGES REQUIRED UNDER
27 SUBSECTIONS (A) AND (B) OF THIS SECTION IF THE CHANGE TO AN EMPLOYEE'S
28 WORK SHIFT:

29 (1) WAS MADE AT THE REQUEST OF THE EMPLOYEE, INCLUDING A
30 REQUEST TO:

31 (I) WORK SPECIFIC HOURS OTHER THAN THOSE SCHEDULED
32 BY THE EMPLOYER; OR

1 **(II) USE SICK LEAVE, VACATION LEAVE, PERSONAL DAYS, OR**
2 **OTHER LEAVE OFFERED BY THE EMPLOYER;**

3 **(2) SUBJECT TO SUBSECTION (D) OF THIS SECTION, IS THE RESULT OF**
4 **A VOLUNTARY, MUTUALLY AGREED ON SHIFT TRADE AMONG EMPLOYEES; OR**

5 **(3) IS NECESSARY TO AVOID A THREAT TO THE HEALTH OR SAFETY OF**
6 **EMPLOYEES OR THE PUBLIC.**

7 **(D) (1) FOR THE PURPOSES OF SUBSECTION (C) OF THIS SECTION, A**
8 **SHIFT TRADE INCLUDES AN INSTANCE IN WHICH THE EMPLOYER TRANSMITS THE**
9 **SHIFT TRADE OFFER TO ALL ELIGIBLE EMPLOYEES AT THE PREVIOUSLY**
10 **SCHEDULED EMPLOYEE'S REQUEST, IF THE EMPLOYER'S TRANSMITTAL IS:**

11 **(I) ACCESSIBLE TO ALL ELIGIBLE EMPLOYEES IN THE FORM OF**
12 **A MASS COMMUNICATION;**

13 **(II) TRANSMITTED ELECTRONICALLY OR IN WRITING AT THE**
14 **WORK SITE; AND**

15 **(III) NOT COERCIVE IN ANY WAY.**

16 **(2) THERE IS A REBUTTABLE PRESUMPTION THAT THE PAY**
17 **REQUIRED UNDER SUBSECTION (A) OR (B) OF THIS SECTION IS OWED IF THE**
18 **EMPLOYER FAILS TO DOCUMENT CONSENT TO THE SHIFT TRADE.**

19 **(E) THE REQUIREMENTS UNDER SUBSECTIONS (A) AND (B) OF THIS**
20 **SECTION DO NOT APPLY DURING PERIODS WHEN OPERATIONS OF THE EMPLOYER**
21 **ARE SUSPENDED DUE TO AN EVENT BEYOND THE EMPLOYER'S CONTROL.**

23 **(A) AN EMPLOYEE HAS THE RIGHT TO DECLINE TO WORK HOURS THAT**
24 **OCCUR DURING THE 11 HOURS FOLLOWING THE END OF A SHIFT.**

25 **(B) AN EMPLOYER SHALL PAY AN EMPLOYEE ONE-AND-A-HALF TIMES THE**
26 **EMPLOYEE'S REGULAR RATE OF PAY FOR ANY HOURS WORKED DURING THE 11**
27 **HOURS FOLLOWING THE END OF A PREVIOUS SHIFT IF THE EMPLOYEE AGREED IN**
28 **WRITING TO WORK THE HOURS.**

30 **(A) EACH EMPLOYER SHALL:**

1 (1) RECORD THE WAGES PAID TO AN EMPLOYEE UNDER §§ 3-1303
2 AND 3-1304 OF THIS SUBTITLE IN THE STATEMENT OF EARNINGS REQUIRED BY §
3 3-504(A)(2) OF THIS TITLE; AND

4 (2) SPECIFY IN THE STATEMENT OF EARNINGS THE TOTAL AMOUNT
5 OF PAY PAID UNDER §§ 3-1303 AND 3-1304 OF THIS SUBTITLE.

6 (B) IF NECESSARY TO CARRY OUT THIS SUBTITLE, THE COMMISSIONER MAY
7 REQUIRE AN EMPLOYER TO:

8 (1) INCLUDE ADDITIONAL INFORMATION IN THE STATEMENT OF
9 EARNINGS; AND

10 (2) USE ADDITIONAL MEANS TO NOTIFY THE EMPLOYER'S
11 EMPLOYEES OF THE INFORMATION REQUIRED TO BE INCLUDED IN THE STATEMENT
12 OF EARNINGS UNDER SUBSECTION (A) OF THIS SECTION.

13 **3-1306.**

14 (A) AN EMPLOYER SHALL GIVE EMPLOYEES NOTICE OF THEIR RIGHTS
15 UNDER THIS SUBTITLE BY CONSPICUOUSLY POSTING NOTICES IN ENGLISH AND
16 SPANISH AT A LOCATION AT THE WORK SITE THAT IS READILY ACCESSIBLE TO ALL
17 EMPLOYEES.

18 (B) THE NOTICES REQUIRED UNDER SUBSECTION (A) OF THIS SECTION
19 SHALL INCLUDE:

20 (1) THE RIGHT TO RECEIVE PAY UNDER §§ 3-1303 AND 3-1304 OF
21 THIS SUBTITLE;

22 (2) A STATEMENT THAT RETALIATION AGAINST EMPLOYEES WHO
23 EXERCISE THEIR RIGHTS UNDER THIS SUBTITLE IS PROHIBITED; AND

24 (3) A STATEMENT THAT EACH EMPLOYEE HAS THE RIGHT TO FILE A
25 COMPLAINT OR BRING A CIVIL ACTION TO ENFORCE THE EMPLOYEE'S RIGHTS
26 UNDER THIS SUBTITLE.

27 **3-1307.**

28 (A) EACH EMPLOYER SHALL KEEP FOR AT LEAST 3 YEARS AN ACCURATE
29 RECORD OF:

1 **(1) THE NAME, ADDRESS, AND OCCUPATION OF EACH EMPLOYEE;**

2 **(2) THE AMOUNT PAID EACH PAY PERIOD TO EACH EMPLOYEE;**

3 **(3) THE HOURS WORKED EACH DAY BY EACH EMPLOYEE;**

4 **(4) THE INITIAL WORK SCHEDULE OF EACH EMPLOYEE;**

5 **(5) THE PAY PAID TO EACH EMPLOYEE UNDER §§ 3-1303 AND 3-1304**
6 **OF THIS SUBTITLE; AND**

7 **(6) ANY SUBSEQUENT REVISIONS TO THE INITIAL WORK SCHEDULE**
8 **OF EACH EMPLOYEE.**

9 **(B) THE EMPLOYER SHALL:**

10 **(1) MAKE THE RECORDS KEPT UNDER SUBSECTION (A) OF THIS**
11 **SECTION AVAILABLE FOR INSPECTION BY THE COMMISSIONER TO THE SAME**
12 **EXTENT AND FOR THE SAME PURPOSES AS RECORDS ARE MADE AVAILABLE TO THE**
13 **COMMISSIONER UNDER § 3-425 OF THIS TITLE; AND**

14 **(2) ALLOW AN EMPLOYEE TO INSPECT AT ANY REASONABLE TIME AND**
15 **PLACE ANY RECORD KEPT UNDER SUBSECTION (A) OF THIS SECTION PERTAINING TO**
16 **THE EMPLOYEE.**

17 **(C) EACH DAY THAT AN EMPLOYER FAILS TO KEEP A RECORD, FALSIFIES A**
18 **RECORD, OR OTHERWISE VIOLATES THIS SECTION SHALL CONSTITUTE A SEPARATE**
19 **VIOLATION.**

20 **3-1308.**

21 **(A) IN THIS SECTION, “RETALIATE” MEANS TO ENGAGE IN ANY FORM OF**
22 **INTIMIDATION, THREAT, REPRISAL, HARASSMENT, DISCRIMINATION, OR ADVERSE**
23 **EMPLOYMENT ACTION, INCLUDING:**

24 **(1) DISCIPLINE;**

25 **(2) DISCHARGE;**

26 **(3) SUSPENSION;**

27 **(4) TRANSFER OR ASSIGNMENT TO A LOWER POSITION IN TERMS OF**
28 **JOB CLASSIFICATION, JOB SECURITY, OR ANY OTHER CONDITION OF EMPLOYMENT;**

1 **(5) REDUCTION IN PAY OR HOURS ASSIGNED;**

2 **(6) DENIAL OF ADDITIONAL HOURS;**

3 **(7) INFORMING ANOTHER EMPLOYER THAT THE EMPLOYEE HAS**
4 **ENGAGED IN ACTIVITIES PROTECTED BY THIS SUBTITLE; OR**

5 **(8) REPORTING OR THREATENING TO REPORT THE ACTUAL OR**
6 **SUSPECTED CITIZENSHIP OR IMMIGRATION STATUS OF AN EMPLOYEE, A FORMER**
7 **EMPLOYEE, OR A FAMILY MEMBER OF AN EMPLOYEE OR A FORMER EMPLOYEE TO A**
8 **FEDERAL, STATE, OR LOCAL AGENCY.**

9 **(B) A PERSON MAY NOT INTERFERE WITH, RESTRAIN, OR DENY THE**
10 **EXERCISE OF, OR THE ATTEMPT TO EXERCISE, ANY RIGHT PROTECTED UNDER THIS**
11 **SUBTITLE.**

12 **(C) AN EMPLOYER MAY NOT RETALIATE AGAINST AN EMPLOYEE BECAUSE**
13 **THE EMPLOYEE HAS:**

14 **(1) DECLINED TO WORK HOURS NOT INCLUDED IN AN INITIAL WORK**
15 **SCHEDULE; OR**

16 **(2) EXERCISED RIGHTS PROTECTED UNDER THIS SUBTITLE,**
17 **INCLUDING THE RIGHT TO:**

18 **(I) FILE A COMPLAINT UNDER § 3-1309 OF THIS SUBTITLE;**

19 **(II) INFORM ANY PERSON ABOUT THE EMPLOYER'S ALLEGED**
20 **VIOLATION OF THIS SUBTITLE;**

21 **(III) COOPERATE WITH THE COMMISSIONER OR ATTORNEY**
22 **GENERAL IN AN INVESTIGATION OF AN ALLEGED VIOLATION OF THIS SUBTITLE; AND**

23 **(IV) INFORM AN INDIVIDUAL REGARDING THE INDIVIDUAL'S**
24 **RIGHTS UNDER THIS SUBTITLE.**

25 **(D) THERE IS A REBUTTABLE PRESUMPTION THAT AN EMPLOYER HAS**
26 **VIOLATED THIS SECTION IF THE EMPLOYER TAKES AN ACTION LISTED IN**
27 **SUBSECTION (A) OF THIS SECTION AGAINST AN EMPLOYEE WITHIN 90 DAYS AFTER**
28 **THE EMPLOYEE:**

1 **(1) FILES A COMPLAINT WITH THE COMMISSIONER UNDER § 3-1309**
2 **OF THIS SUBTITLE ALLEGING A VIOLATION OF THIS SUBTITLE OR BRINGS A CIVIL**
3 **ACTION UNDER § 3-1310 OF THIS SUBTITLE;**

4 **(2) INFORMS A PERSON ABOUT AN ALLEGED VIOLATION OF THIS**
5 **SUBTITLE BY THE EMPLOYER WITH THE EMPLOYER'S KNOWLEDGE;**

6 **(3) COOPERATES WITH THE COMMISSIONER OR ANOTHER PERSON IN**
7 **THE INVESTIGATION OR PROSECUTION OF AN ALLEGED VIOLATION OF THIS**
8 **SUBTITLE BY THE EMPLOYER;**

9 **(4) OPPOSES ANY POLICY, PRACTICE, OR ACT THAT IS UNLAWFUL**
10 **UNDER THIS SUBTITLE; OR**

11 **(5) INFORMS AN INDIVIDUAL OF THE INDIVIDUAL'S RIGHTS UNDER**
12 **THIS SUBTITLE WITH THE EMPLOYER'S KNOWLEDGE.**

13 **(E) THE PROTECTIONS AFFORDED UNDER THIS SECTION SHALL APPLY TO**
14 **AN EMPLOYEE WHO MISTAKENLY, BUT IN GOOD FAITH, ALLEGES A VIOLATION OF**
15 **THIS SUBTITLE.**

16 **3-1309.**

17 **(A) (1) A PERSON MAY FILE A COMPLAINT ALLEGING A VIOLATION OF**
18 **THIS SUBTITLE WITH THE COMMISSIONER.**

19 **(2) THE COMMISSIONER SHALL KEEP CONFIDENTIAL THE IDENTITY**
20 **OF A PERSON THAT FILES A COMPLAINT UNLESS DISCLOSURE IS NECESSARY FOR**
21 **THE RESOLUTION OF ANY INVESTIGATION OR IS OTHERWISE REQUIRED BY LAW.**

22 **(3) IF THE COMMISSIONER NEEDS TO DISCLOSE THE IDENTITY OF A**
23 **PERSON THAT FILES A COMPLAINT, THE COMMISSIONER SHALL, TO THE EXTENT**
24 **PRACTICABLE, NOTIFY THE PERSON BEFORE THE DISCLOSURE IS MADE.**

25 **(B) (1) ON RECEIPT OF A COMPLAINT FILED UNDER SUBSECTION (A)(1)**
26 **OF THIS SECTION, THE COMMISSIONER SHALL SEND A LETTER TO THE EMPLOYER.**

27 **(2) THE LETTER SHALL:**

28 **(I) STATE THAT THERE IS A COMPLAINT ALLEGING A**
