AN ACT concerning

## Procurement – Department of General Services – Exemption for Historic Structures

FOR the purpose of providing that certain provisions of law do not apply to procurement by the Department of General Services for the renovation of a structure built during certain centuries or listed in or eligible for listing in the National Register of Historic Places, to the extent necessary to preserve the historic fabric of the structure, as determined by the Department in consultation with the Maryland Historical Trust; and generally relating to exemptions from the procurement law.

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

## Article - State Finance and Procurement

- (a) Except as provided in subsection (b) of this section, this Division II does not apply to:
  - (1) procurement by:

(xvii) the Department of General Services for the <del>renovation</del> **REHABILITATION** of a structure that÷

## 1. was built during the 18th or 19th century; [and] OR

is listed in or eligible for listing in the National Register of Historic Places, TO THE EXTENT THE PROCUREMENT IS NECESSARY TO PRESERVE THE HISTORIC FABRIC OF THE STRUCTURE IMPACTED BY THE REHABILITATION, AS DETERMINED BY THE DEPARTMENT OF GENERAL SERVICES IN CONSULTATION WITH THE MARYLAND HISTORICAL TRUST; and

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 2017.
