House Bill 20 (Delegate S. Howard)

Health and Government Operations

General Provisions - Commemorative Days - Farmers' Day

This bill requires the Governor to annually proclaim the last day of spring (the day before the summer solstice) as Farmers' Day.

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: Commemorating Farmers' Day does not affect State finances.

Local Effect: None.

Small Business Effect: None.

Analysis

Current Law: Sixteen official commemorative days, six months and one week are recognized in State law, as shown in **Exhibit 1**. The Governor also must issue a proclamation each year encouraging citizens and other individuals to observe a moment of silence at 3:00 p.m. on Memorial Day to unite in remembrance and commemorate the heroic acts and efforts of Marylanders who have served and died in the U.S. Armed Forces.

Background: Approximately 350,000 people are employed in some aspect of agriculture, making it the largest commercial industry in Maryland. In 2015, 12,200 Maryland farms averaged 166 acres each. In 2014, net farm income in Maryland was more than \$590 million, while income per farm averaged \$47,580. The market value of all agricultural products totaled more than \$2.4 billion. Maryland's top agricultural products are broiler chickens, greenhouse/nursery plants, corn, soybeans, and dairy products.
