Farming 4 Hunger, Inc. is a 501(c)(3) founded in 4/1/2012 to grow fresh food for the hunger community; provide meaningful training and skills for men in the Southern Maryland DOC Pre-Release; provide addiction prevention education to school children, athletic teams and others who volunteer at the Farm. Our four core areas of focus are Second Chance Citizens, Youth, Hunger and Community. We do this by: Growing healthy food to address the hunger problem in the Southern Maryland Community and the State. Offering volunteer opportunities to let people experience the process of helping others Helping community members and volunteers internally struggling regain hope through experience sharing Addressing drug abuse and alcohol prevention for children and young adults Helping ex-cons rehabilitate and contribute to their community

The purpose for the project is to finish the remaining 5,000 square feet of the 10,000 square foot Thomas L. Hance Life Share Building which Farming 4 Hunger leases from Serenity Farm through a long-term renewable lease. The space will include: an office, bathroom, conference/training room, value-added prep space, walk-in fridge, and space for sorting, packaging and distributing fresh produce that we deliver to the hunger community. Finishing this space is necessary for Farming 4 Hunger to work more efficiently, build capacity, continue training inmates and students in agricultural activities, and carry out our work with the community.
