Education, Health, and Environmental Affairs

Municipal Elections - Voting by Individuals Not Lawfully Present in the United States

This bill prohibits an individual who is not lawfully present in the United States from voting in a municipal election. If a municipality allows individuals who are residents of the municipality but are not citizens of the United States to vote in municipal elections, the municipality must verify the lawful presence in the United States of each such individual before the individual votes.

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: None.

Local Effect: The bill is not expected to have a material fiscal impact on affected

municipalities.

Small Business Effect: None.

Analysis

Current Law/Background: State election law governs State, county, and Baltimore City elections held during statewide elections every two years, and special elections, but generally does not govern municipal elections other than those in Baltimore City (which is considered a "county" for purposes of State law). In order to register to vote in elections governed by State election law, a person must be a citizen of the United States.

Municipal elections are held at various times and with different frequency. Information provided by the Maryland Municipal League indicates there are at least six municipalities

in the State that allow residents who are not U.S. citizens to vote in municipal elections. Five of these municipalities are located in Montgomery County (Garrett Park, Glen Echo, Martin's Additions, Somerset, and Takoma Park) and one is located in Prince George's County (Hyattsville).
