10. Description and Purpose of Organization (Limit length to visible area)

Liberty Community Development Corporation Inc. is an IRS 501 (c)(3) Community Development Corporation established in 2003. Our mission is to enhance the quality of life for residents in Central Maryland. We accomplish our mission through community service programs and community outreach initiatives that promote improvement in the quality of lives of youth and their families. Over the past 5 years, in conjunction with our community partners, we have provided book scholarships, middle and high school male and female mentoring, tobacco and sexually transmitted infections education, summer youth enrichment, school supplies and food to over 10,000 youth and 2,000 families in Central Maryland.

11. Description and Purpose of Project (Limit length to visible area)

Liberty Community Development Corporation is establishing a new 13,000 square foot community youth center located in Woodlawn, Md. The facility will include a gymnasium, computer lab, meeting and training rooms and will be a safe place for youth and their families. Programs and elements include workforce development, re-entry, after-school program, male and female mentoring, leadership, health and wellness, crime prevention, educational enrichment, social interaction, cultural enrichment, life skills, sports and fitness. The youth center will also provide adults with the opportunity to participate in various training and development programs to include parenting and family enrichment, home ownership, marriage enrichment and financial literacy.

28. Comments

In 2016 Liberty Community Development Corporation with the support of the Robert Woods Johnson Foundation (County Health Rankings and Roadmaps) and data provided by Baltimore County Police Department, Maryland Department of Health and Mental Hygiene, Baltimore County Health Department, Lifebridge Health and Maryland Department of Labor, Licensing and Regulations conducted a community needs assessment of our primary catchment area (PCA) of Catonsville, Milford Mill, Randallstown, and Woodlawn.

The major findings are:

- 1. Part 1 violent crime rates for Catonsville, Milford Mill and Randallstown are considerably higher than part 1 violent crime rates at the county, state and national levels.
- 2. Woodlawn and Milford Mill have lower levels of educational attainment compared to Randallstown and Catonsville.
- 3. Milford Mill, Randallstown and Woodlawn sexually transmitted infections such as chlamydia and gonorrhea, incidence rates are significantly higher than county, state and national incidence rates. The younger the age the higher rate of infection.
- 4. Milford Mill, Randallstown and Woodlawn accounts for approximately 14% of Baltimore County's population but 26.8% and 26.4% of Baltimore County's HIV and AIDS diagnosis respectively for the adult/adolescent population.
- 5. Unemployment rates for the PCA were trending upward, while unemployment rates at the county, state and national levels were trending downward.
- 6. Milford Mill has a lower life expectancy and median household income below county and state levels. It also has a lower proportion of husband-wife households, low rates of home ownership and high rates of rental occupancy.
- 7. The PCA lacks adequate assets to provide a comprehensive approach to the key findings stated above.

Based on the key findings of the community needs assessment, LCDC is proposing the establishment of a community youth center designed to provide a comprehensive approach to the community needs and to increase the quality of life for the individuals in the PCA.

Benefits of LCDC community youth center are job creation, healthier community, stronger families, education and economic empowerment, safe haven, crime prevention, comprehensive approach to community needs and re-entry program.
