The Pomonkey High School Alumni Association, Inc. is a 501(c)(3) organization, dedicated								

to preserving the rich history of the first black high school in Charles County, Maryland.

11. Description and Purpose of Project (Limit length to visible area)

The renovated Pomonkey High School Building building will be used as a community center, and as a museum and archive for research, and the display of artifacts, memorabilia, and photographs associated with the African American Community. It will be available for use by other local non-profit organizations. The initial Phase One will include exterior preservation of the existing building; the next phase will be the construction of interior building systems, and the development of an initial display area for local history. The initial phase has been successfully bid and is now in the contract and permit stage. It is anticipated that this \$95,000 contract will begin later this spring. The overall goal of this portion of the project is to complete the rehabilitation of the existing 1950s Pomonkey High School Building and for the future reconstruction of the 1930s wing of the building for use as additional museum, program, and community space.

28. Comments

The project will provide a permanent location for a small museum where Old Pomonkey High School will house, display and archive artifacts, memorabilia, photographs and available documents associated with the post Civil War history of the Bryans Road neighborhood, Charles County and Southern Maryland. After future phases of work are completed, the Old Pomonkey High School will be able to accommodate public and private events and community celebrations. The classrooms in the reconstructed building (which will be completed in the future to the requirements of the Secretary of the Interior's standards and as defined by the National Park Services Division of Historic Preservation,) will serve as sites for community programs including mentoring, tutoring, computer literacy, etc.

In addition, it is anticipated that a partnership with a community serving medical dialysis and rehabilitation clinic could be built and accommodated within the reconstructed building.

It is one goal of the Alumni Association to provide space for smaller, local nonprofits to hold public outreach events, and perhaps have a base of operations for their programs, rather like an incubator space for startups.

The site will have dedicated parking, convenient walks, landscaping, and there will be interpretive markers throughout the site and building to explain the history and significance of the site. Additionally, there will be an outdoor event space accessible by site and from the building for community events.
