10. Description and Purpose of Organization (Limit length to visible area)

The City of College Park was incorporated in 1945 and is the home to approximately 30,000 residents and the University of Maryland. The City comprises five square miles situated primarily along Baltimore Avenue, and is only seven miles northeast of Washington, D.C. The City of College Park's vision includes becoming a vibrant and prosperous top 20 college town with distinctive neighborhoods, thriving commercial districts, cultural amenities, transportation systems serving all users, and a strong sense of community pride. City Council, staff, and residents work together to provide excellent services and amenities for residents, businesses, and visitors.

11. Description and Purpose of Project (Limit length to visible area)

Duvall Field is the City's major park, and it requires significant renovations. The City is completing a new concession/restroom building and surrounding recreation plaza in the spring 2017. The remaining Duvall Field projects include the replacement and upgrade of the athletic field lighting, major renovation of all playing fields, and the replacement of the playground equipment. This bond bill request is to partially fund the installation of a new field lighting system. The existing light fixtures are very old and inefficient. Costly electrical repairs have been made the past few years to maintain this system, but the lighting is still poor. The new lighting system will save on electrical costs while providing quality light levels necessary for nighttime use of the fields.
