## **10. Description and Purpose of Organization** (Limit length to visible area)

End Hunger in Calvert County (EHCC) is the largest food distribution center in Southern Maryland. Distributing nearly 1,000,000 pounds of food a year, it is the virtual hub for hunger solutions in the Tri-County Area. EHCC is accredited through the Better Business Bureau, meeting all 20 standards for Charitable accountability. A key element of our success is our ability to cross denominational lines and work with area churches as well as small businesses. EHCC has 44 Partner Feeding Organizations. Together we feed over 15,000 people every year. EHCC has grown from a food distribution entity to an overall solutions model by breaking the cycle of poverty. This model includes practical job skills training and financial rehabilitation. These programs train people towards "living wage careers" by placing them into Maryland's growing job sectors.

## 11. Description and Purpose of Project (Limit length to visible area)

End Hunger leases 12,000 square feet of warehouse. The lease expires in 2020. Based on the lease cost versus the cost of building and owning, it is more cost efficient to build and own. EHCC has sufficient land available on Route 4, centrally located and with easier access. This new location would house a self-sustaining Hunger Solutions Center that could serve a broad area of Mid to Southern Maryland. Our strength has been our ability to customize our programming to the current needs of our specific region. Owning our own warehouse would allow us to not only stabilize our current operations but expand and respond as the problems and solutions to ending hunger evolve in our area. The cost of building/developing our own warehouse is approximately 2.1M. We are seeking state and federal assistance to build our own warehouse, thus ensuring stability, growth and ultimately long term progress towards ending hunger in our area.
