- 4 FOR the purpose of establishing a country club off-sale permit in Montgomery County; $\mathbf{5}$ authorizing the Board of License Commissioners for Montgomery County to issue 6 the permit to a holder of a country club license; authorizing a holder of the permit to 7 sell wine by the bottle for off-premises consumption only at certain tasting events, 8 to certain individuals, and during certain hours and days; requiring a permit holder 9 to notify the Board in writing a certain number of days before each tasting event; 10 prohibiting a permit holder from holding more than a certain number of tasting events in a calendar year or in a single month; authorizing the Board to set a certain 11 12permit fee: and generally relating to sales of alcoholic beverages in Montgomery 13 County.
