# Public Safety – Maryland Police Training and Standards Commission – Psychological Consultation and Evaluation

FOR the purpose of repealing the requirement that the Maryland Police Training and
Standards Commission develop standards for the mandatory psychological
evaluation of a certain law enforcement officer; requiring the Commission to develop
standards for the mandatory psychological consultation with a certain law
enforcement officer; altering a certain psychological evaluation requirement for
police officer certification; and generally relating to the mental health of law
enforcement officers.
