Public Safety – Maryland Police Training and Standards Commission – Psychological Consultation and Evaluation

4 FOR the purpose of repealing the requirement that the Maryland Police Training and $\mathbf{5}$ Standards Commission develop standards for the mandatory psychological 6 evaluation of a certain law enforcement officer; requiring the Commission to develop 7standards for the mandatory psychological consultation with a certain law 8 enforcement officer; altering a certain psychological evaluation requirement for 9 police officer certification repealing a requirement that a certain psychological 10 evaluation for a police officer certification be conducted by a certain psychologist; and generally relating to the mental health of law enforcement officers. 11

Each certificate issued to a police officer under this subtitle remains the 25(c)26property of the Commission. 27SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July

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1, 2018.
