CHAPTER	

1 AN ACT concerning

2 Procurement – Small Businesses and Minority Businesses – Qualification and Certification

4 FOR the purpose of requiring the Secretary of General Services, the Secretary of 5 Transportation, the Chancellor of the University System of Maryland, and the 6 President of Morgan State University to adopt regulations to require the 7 qualification of a business as a small business in a certain manner if the business 8 has obtained a certain federal certification; altering a requirement that certain 9 regulations promote and facilitate certification of minority business enterprises that 10 have received a certain federal certification; requiring the Board of Public Works to 11 adopt regulations to require that provide for the certification of a business as a 12 minority business enterprise in a certain manner if the business has obtained a 13 certain federal certification and meets certain eligibility requirements; and generally 14 relating to procurement by small businesses and minority businesses.

20 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,

21 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 3 (a) By regulation, the Secretary of General Services, the Secretary of 4 Transportation, the Chancellor of the University System of Maryland, and the President of 5 Morgan State University each shall specify the criteria that a business must meet to qualify
- 6 as a small business.
- 7 (b) (1) The criteria for qualification as a small business may vary among 8 industries to reflect their particular characteristics.
- 9 (2) Regulations adopted under this section shall include, for each class of business, the maximum number of employees a business may have to qualify as a small business.
- 12 (C) THE REGULATIONS ADOPTED UNDER SUBSECTION (A) OF THIS SECTION 13 SHALL REQUIRE THE QUALIFICATION OF A BUSINESS AS A SMALL BUSINESS:
- 14 (1) IF THE BUSINESS HAS OBTAINED CERTIFICATION AS A SMALL 15 BUSINESS UNDER A FEDERAL SMALL BUSINESS CERTIFICATION PROGRAM; AND
- 16 (2) WITHOUT FILING ANY ADDITIONAL PAPERWORK OTHER THAN EVIDENCE OF THE FEDERAL CERTIFICATION.

- 19 (a) (1) (i) In accordance with Title 10, Subtitle 1 of the State Government 20 Article, the Board shall adopt regulations consistent with the purposes of this Division II 21 to carry out the requirements of this subtitle.
- 22 (ii) The Board shall keep a record of information regarding any waivers requested in accordance with § 14–302(a)(9)(i) of this subtitle and subsection (b)(12) of this section and submit a copy of the record to the General Assembly on or before October 1 of each year, in accordance with § 2–1246 of the State Government Article.
- (iii) The Board shall keep a record of the aggregate number and the identity of minority business enterprises that receive certification under the process established by the Board under subsection (b)(1) of this section and submit a copy of the record to the General Assembly on or before October 1 of each year, in accordance with § 2–1246 of the State Government Article.
- 31 (2) The regulations shall establish procedures to be followed by units, 32 prospective contractors, and successful bidders or offerors to maximize notice to, and the 33 opportunity to participate in the procurement process by, a broad range of minority 34 business enterprises.

1 (b) These regulations shall include: 2 (1) provisions: 3 designating one State agency to certify and decertify minority (i) business enterprises for all units through a single process that meets applicable federal 4 requirements, including provisions that promote and facilitate the submission of some or 5 6 all of the certification application through an electronic process; 7 (ii) for the purpose of certification under this subtitle, that promote 8 and facilitate certification of minority business enterprises that have received certification 9 from [the U.S. Small Business Administration] A FEDERAL or a county PROGRAM that uses a certification process substantially similar to the process established in accordance 10 with item (i) of this item, INCLUDING A PROVISION THAT REQUIRES PROVIDES FOR 11 12 CERTIFICATION OF A BUSINESS AS A MINORITY BUSINESS ENTERPRISE IF THE 13 **BUSINESS:** 1. 14 HE THE BUSINESS HAS OBTAINED CERTIFICATION AS A 15 MINORITY BUSINESS UNDER A FEDERAL MINORITY BUSINESS CERTIFICATION 16 PROGRAM UNDER THE FEDERAL DISADVANTAGED BUSINESS ENTERPRISE 17 PROGRAM; AND 18 WITHOUT FILING ANY ADDITIONAL PAPERWORK 19 OTHER THAN EVIDENCE OF THE FEDERAL CERTIFICATION: 20<u>2.</u> MEETS THE ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS OF THE 21MINORITY BUSINESS ENTERPRISE PROGRAM; 22(iii) requiring the agency designated to certify minority business enterprises to complete the agency's review of an application for certification and notify the 23 applicant of the agency's decision within 90 days of receipt of a complete application that 24includes all of the information necessary for the agency to make a decision; and 25 26 authorizing the agency designated to certify minority business 27 enterprises to extend the notification requirement established under item (iii) of this item 28 once, for no more than an additional 60 days, if the agency provides the applicant with a 29 written notice and explanation;

- 30 (2) a requirement that the solicitation document accompanying each 31 solicitation set forth the expected degree of minority business enterprise participation 32 based, in part, on the factors set forth in § 14–302(a)(3)(ii) of this subtitle;
- 33 (3) a requirement that bidders or offerors complete a document setting 34 forth the percentage of the total dollar amount of the contract that the bidder or offeror 35 agrees will be performed by certified minority business enterprises;

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- (4) a requirement that within 10 days after notice from the prime contractor of the State's intent to award a contract, each minority business enterprise serving as a subcontractor on the contract complete a document setting forth the percentage and type of work assigned to the subcontractor under the contract and submit copies of the completed form to both the procurement officer and the contractor;
- (5) a requirement that the solicitation documents completed and submitted by the bidder or offeror in connection with its minority business enterprise participation commitment must be attached to and made a part of the contract;
- 9 (6) a requirement that all contracts containing minority business 10 enterprise participation goals shall contain a liquidated damages provision that applies in 11 the event that the contractor fails to comply in good faith with the provisions of this subtitle 12 or the pertinent terms of the applicable contract;
- 13 (7) a requirement that the unit provide a current list of certified minority business enterprises to each prospective contractor;
- 15 (8) provisions to ensure the uniformity of requests for bids on subcontracts;
- 16 (9) provisions relating to the timing of requests for bids on subcontracts and of submission of bids on subcontracts;
- 18 (10) provisions designed to ensure that a fiscal disadvantage to the State does not result from an inadequate response by minority business enterprises to a request 20 for bids;
- 21 (11) provisions relating to joint ventures, under which a bidder may count 22 toward meeting its minority business enterprise participation goal, the minority business 23 enterprise portion of the joint venture;
 - (12) consistent with § 14–302(a)(9) of this subtitle, provisions relating to any circumstances under which a unit may waive obligations of the contractor relating to minority business enterprise participation;
 - (13) provisions requiring a monthly submission to the unit by minority business enterprises acknowledging all payments received in the preceding 30 days under a contract governed by this subtitle;
- 30 (14) a requirement that a unit shall verify and maintain data concerning 31 payments received by minority business enterprises, including a requirement that, upon 32 completion of a project, the unit shall compare the total dollar value actually received by 33 minority business enterprises with the amount of contract dollars initially awarded, and 34 an explanation of any discrepancies therein;
