Prince George's County - Vehicle Laws - Authority to Tow <del>Abandoned</del> Vehicles

FOR the purpose of <u>prohibiting the governing body of Prince George's County and the police department in Prince George's County from using other persons, equipment, or facilities for removing, preserving, and storing vehicles under State and local law except under certain circumstances; altering the definition of "police department" to include an entity appropriate agency or department designated by the County Executive of Prince George's County for purposes of provisions relating to the towing of abandoned vehicles in Prince George's County; <u>making conforming changes</u>, <u>making this Act an emergency measure</u>; and generally relating to the authority to tow <del>abandoned</del> vehicles in Prince George's County.</u>


