- SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,

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necessary or appropriate to carry out the powers and duties of the Commission under thissubtitle; [and]

3 (24) to consult and cooperate with commanders of SWAT teams to develop 4 standards for training and deployment of SWAT teams and of law enforcement officers who 5 are not members of a SWAT team who conduct no-knock warrant service in the State based 6 on best practices in the State and nationwide; AND

7 (25) TO REQUIRE, FOR ENTRANCE-LEVEL POLICE TRAINING AND 8 ANNUALLY FOR IN-SERVICE LEVEL POLICE TRAINING CONDUCTED BY THE STATE 9 AND EACH COUNTY AND MUNICIPAL POLICE TRAINING SCHOOL, THAT THE 10 CURRICULUM AND MINIMUM COURSES OF STUDY INCLUDE TRAINING ABOUT:

11(I)THE STATE'S MEDICAL CANNABIS PROGRAM UNDER TITLE1213, SUBTITLE 33 OF THE HEALTH – GENERAL ARTICLE; AND

13(II)CIVIL AND CRIMINAL OFFENSES INVOLVING CANNABIS OR14MARIJUANA.

15 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 16 October 1, 2018.

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
