CHAPTER
AN ACT concerning
Emergency Medical Services – Emergency Medical Services Board – Appointments
FOR the purpose of repealing a provision that prohibits the Governor from appointing a member of the Board of Regents of the University System of Maryland, <u>a member of</u> the Board of Directors of the Medical System Corporation, or an officer or a full—time employee of the Medical System Corporation or the University of Maryland, Baltimore Campus to the Emergency Medical Services Board; <u>prohibiting the Governor from appointing more than two persons from the same health system, a health system and medical school that are affiliated, or medical schools under the same governing board to the Emergency Medical Services Board; and generally relating to appointments to the Emergency Medical Services Board.</u>
