- FOR the purpose of repealing a provision that prohibits the Governor from appointing a 4 5 member of the Board of Regents of the University System of Maryland, the Board of 6 Directors of the Medical System Corporation, or an officer or a full-time employee of 7 the Medical System Corporation or the University of Maryland, Baltimore Campus 8 to the Emergency Medical Services Board; prohibiting the Governor from appointing 9 more than two persons from the same health system, a health system and medical school that are affiliated, or medical schools under the same governing board to the 10 Emergency Medical Services Board; and generally relating to appointments to the 11 12 Emergency Medical Services Board.
