12	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,

14 Article - Public Safety

That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

15 **3–511.1.**

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- 16 (A) (1) IN THIS SECTION THE FOLLOWING WORDS HAVE THE MEANINGS 17 INDICATED.
- 18 (2) "LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCY" HAS THE MEANING STATED IN § 19 3–201 OF THIS TITLE.
- 20 (3) "LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICER" MEANS ANY PERSON WHO, IN AN 21 OFFICIAL CAPACITY, IS AUTHORIZED TO MAKE ARRESTS AND WHO IS AN EMPLOYEE
- 22 OF A LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCY.



- 1 (B) A LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICER MAY NOT INTENTIONALLY DISABLE OR
 2 FAIL TO ACTIVATE A BODY-WORN CAMERA IN VIOLATION OF THE BODY-WORN
 3 CAMERA POLICY DEVELOPED IN ACCORDANCE WITH § 3–511 OF THIS SUBTITLE BY
 4 THE MARYLAND POLICE TRAINING AND STANDARDS COMMISSION.
- 5 (C) A PERSON WHO VIOLATES THIS SECTION IS GUILTY OF A FELONY AND ON CONVICTION IS SUBJECT TO IMPRISONMENT NOT EXCEEDING 10 YEARS OR A FINE NOT EXCEEDING \$100,000 OR BOTH.
- 8 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 9 October 1, 2018.
