3 FOR the purpose of adding Palmer amaranth to the list of plants considered to be noxious weeds in the State requiring the Department of Agriculture to conduct a study to 4 assess the adverse financial impact of Palmer amaranth on the agricultural industry $\mathbf{5}$ 6 in the State and to determine the necessary actions certain persons must take to 7 reduce the impact and the costs of the actions; requiring the Department to consult with certain persons in conducting the study and to submit a certain report to the 8 9 Governor and the General Assembly on or before a certain date; and generally 10 relating to invasive weed control in the State.
