- FOR the purpose of altering a certain provision of law to exempt a prescriber from being required to request certain data from the Pharmacy Drug Monitoring Program if the opioid or benzodiazepine is prescribed or dispensed to an individual to treat or prevent acute pain for a certain period of time following a any surgical procedure which regional anesthesia, including certain techniques, was used, rather than only surgical procedures in which general anesthesia was used; making this Act subject to a certain contingency; and generally relating to the Pharmacy Drug Monitoring Program.
