25	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
26	That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- a (a) In this section, "qualified nonprofit entity" means a procurement organization exempt from taxation under § 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code or an entity exempt from taxation under § 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code that actively functions in a supporting relationship to one or more procurement organizations if the procurement organization or other entity has a board of directors whose members are experienced in:
- 8 (1) Organ, tissue, and eye donation;
- 9 (2) Working with donors and donor families; and
- 10 (3) Educating the public about the importance of the process of organ, 11 tissue, and eye donation.
- 12 (b) (1) The Secretary of Health shall contract with a qualified nonprofit entity 13 for the establishment, maintenance, and operation of a donor registry.
- 14 (2) The Secretary of Health shall use funds from the Organ and Tissue
 15 Donation Awareness Fund [established under Title 13, Subtitle 9] AS REQUIRED UNDER
 16 § 13–901 of the Health General Article [or] AND any other funds as may be appropriate
 17 to compensate the nonprofit entity contracted with under paragraph (1) of this subsection
 18 for the reasonable cost of establishing, maintaining, and operating the donor registry,
 19 including the reasonable cost of public education programs to increase public awareness
 20 about the existence and purpose of the registry and organ, tissue, and eye donation.

- 23 (a) (1) There is an Organ and Tissue Donation Awareness Fund.
- 24 (2) The Fund consists of money collected under $\$ 16–111.2(f) of the 25 Transportation Article.
- 26 (3) The Fund is a special, [continuing,] nonlapsing fund that is not subject 27 to § 7–302 of the State Finance and Procurement Article.
- 28 (4) The **STATE** Treasurer shall separately hold and the **STATE** 29 Comptroller shall account for the Fund.
- 30 (5) The Fund shall be invested and reinvested in the same manner as other 31 State funds.

Any investment earnings shall be retained to the credit of the Fund.

- 2 (b) (1) The Fund shall be managed and supervised by the Secretary or the Secretary's designee.

 4 (2) (I) The Fund shall be used to promote public education and awareness about organ, tissue, and eye donations and to fund the establishment, operation, and maintenance of a donor registry as provided in § 4–516 of the Estates and Trusts Article.
- 8 (II) AT LEAST \$400,000 SHALL BE DISTRIBUTED ANNUALLY 9 FROM THE FUND TO THE QUALIFIED NONPROFIT ENTITY DESCRIBED IN § 4–516 OF 10 THE ESTATES AND TRUSTS ARTICLE.
- 11 (3) The Fund shall be subject to audit by the Office of Legislative Audits 12 under Title 2, Subtitle 12 of the State Government Article.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2018.
