CHAPTER _____

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Local Government – Municipal Elections – No–Excuse Absentee Voting**

3 FOR the purpose of prohibiting a municipality from requiring an individual to provide a
4 certain reason in order to vote by absentee ballot; and generally relating to absentee
5 voting in municipal elections.

11 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
12 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

13 **Article – Local Government**

14 4–108.

15 (a) A qualified voter may vote in a municipal election by absentee ballot.

16 (b) **(1) [A] SUBJECT TO PARAGRAPH (2) OF THIS SUBSECTION, A**
17 municipality shall provide a procedure to vote by absentee ballot.

1 **(2) A MUNICIPALITY MAY NOT REQUIRE AN INDIVIDUAL TO PROVIDE**
2 **A REASON THAT THE INDIVIDUAL WILL BE UNABLE TO VOTE IN PERSON ON**
3 **ELECTION DAY IN ORDER TO VOTE BY ABSENTEE BALLOT.**

4 (c) A municipality may use any method to enable absentee voters to vote,
5 including using any facilities to transmit and receive applications for absentee ballots.

6 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect June
7 1, 2018.
