1 AN ACT concerning

Harford County - Alcoholic Beverages - Clubs, Firehouses, and Multiple Event Licenses

FOR the purpose of authorizing a holder of a certain Class C-1 (organization or club), C-2 4 $\mathbf{5}$ (organization or club), or C-3 (country club, topiary garden, or yacht or boat club) 6 license in Harford County to sell or provide beer, wine, or liquor for on-premises 7 consumption by certain nonmembers and guests under certain circumstances; 8 authorizing a fire department in Harford County that holds a multiple event beer 9 and wine license to sell or provide beer and wine for on-premises consumption at an 10 entertainment event held by the fire department or by a person that has rented or 11 leased an area of the licensed premises; requiring the fire department to contract to 12 provide food or ensure that food is available for consumption at a certain event; 13repealing the Class C-3 multiple event (on-sale) beer, wine, and liquor license in 14 Harford County; and generally relating to alcoholic beverages licenses in Harford 15County.
