18 19 20	(f) A homeowner who meets the requirements of this section shall be granted the property tax credit under this section against the property tax imposed on the real property of the dwelling.
21 22 23	(g) (1) Except as provided in subsection (h) of this section, the property tax credit under this section is the total real property tax of a dwelling, less the percentage of the combined income of the homeowner that is described in paragraph (2) of this subsection
24	(2) The percentage is:
25	(i) 0% of the 1st \$8,000 of combined income;
26	(ii) 4% of the next \$4,000 of combined income;
27	(iii) 6.5% of the next \$4,000 of combined income; and
28	(iv) 9% of the combined income over \$16,000.

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- 1 (h) For home purchasers, the property tax credit is the amount of the credit as 2 calculated under subsection (g) of this section multiplied by a fraction, where:
  - (1) the numerator of the fraction is the number of days in the fiscal year that the home purchaser actually occupies or expects to actually occupy a dwelling in which the home purchaser has a legal interest; and
- 6 (2) the denominator is 365 days.
- 7 (j) (1) A property tax credit under this section may not be granted to a 8 homeowner whose combined net worth exceeds \$200,000 as of December 31 of the calendar 9 year that precedes the year in which the homeowner applies for the property tax credit or whose combined gross income exceeds \$60,000 in that same calendar year.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect June 1, 2018, and shall be applicable to tax credits for all taxable years beginning after June 30, 2018.
