A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

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Baltimore County - Alcoholic Beverages - Sunday Sales

- 3 FOR the purpose of authorizing the Board of License Commissioners for Baltimore County to grant a Sunday permit to a holder of a Class A beer, wine, and liquor license for 4 5 an additional permit fee to be established by the Board and not exceeding a certain 6 amount; establishing that the permit authorizes the holder to sell alcoholic 7 beverages for off-premises consumption on Sunday during certain hours; requiring 8 the Board to conduct a certain economic impact study within a certain time period 9 and, under certain circumstances, to work with certain license holders in developing an additional fee for the Sunday permit and mitigating a certain impact; and 10 11 generally relating to sales of alcoholic beverages on Sundays in Baltimore County.

AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, within 120 days after the provisions of Section 1 of this Act become effective, the Board of License Commissioners for 12 13 Baltimore County shall: 14 conduct a study to ascertain whether granting Sunday permits in (1) 15 accordance with Section 1 of this Act will result in any economic impact on the existing 16 holders of licenses that allow Sunday sales of alcoholic beverages in Baltimore County; and 17 if the Board determines that granting Sunday permits will result in a demonstrable economic impact on existing license holders, work with the license holders in 18 developing an additional fee for the Sunday permit and mitigating the impact. 19
- SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 2018.
