A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

Task Force to Study the Feasibility of Establishing a Shelter Animal Refuge

- 3 FOR the purpose of establishing the Task Force to Study the Feasibility of Establishing a 4 Shelter Animal Refuge; providing for the composition, chair, and staffing of the Task 5 Force; prohibiting a member of the Task Force from receiving certain compensation, 6 but authorizing the reimbursement of certain expenses; requiring the Task Force to 7 study, analyze, identify, evaluate, and make recommendations regarding certain 8 matters; requiring the Task Force to report its findings and recommendations to the 9 Governor and the General Assembly on or before a certain date; providing for the termination of this Act; and generally relating to the Task Force to Study the 10 11 Feasibility of Establishing a Shelter Animal Refuge.
- 12 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,

13 That:

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14 (a) There is a Task Force to Study the Feasibility of Establishing a Shelter Animal

15 Refuge.

- 16 (b) The Task Force consists of the following members:
- 17 (1) two members of the Senate of Maryland, appointed by the President of 18 the Senate:
- 19 (2) two members of the House of Delegates, appointed by the Speaker of 20 the House;
- 21 (3) the Comptroller, or the Comptroller's designee;
- 22 (4) the Secretary of Agriculture, or the Secretary's designee;

16 17 18	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect June 1, 2018. It shall remain effective for a period of 1 year and, at the end of May 31, 2019, this Act, with no further action required by the General Assembly, shall be abrogated and of no									

further force and effect.

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
