### A BILL ENTITLED

#### 1 AN ACT concerning

# Education - Salaries of Noncertificated Public School Employees - Minimum Living Salaries

4 FOR the purpose of requiring that certain public school employees in certain areas be paid at least certain minimum living salaries; specifying the minimum living salaries that  $\mathbf{5}$ 6 are in effect for certain time periods; increasing the minimum living salaries in effect 7 for certain time periods based on a certain Consumer Price Index for All Urban 8 Consumers; requiring that a certain minimum living salary remain the same as the 9 salary that was in effect for a certain time period under certain circumstances; 10 requiring that a certain contract for certain services require that the third party provide certain working conditions and standards and pay at least a certain 11 minimum living salary; defining certain terms; providing for the construction and 1213application of this Act; and generally relating to the minimum living salaries for 14 noncertificated public school employees.

A CONTRACT ENTERED INTO BY A PUBLIC SCHOOL EMPLOYER AND A THIRD
PARTY FOR SERVICES THAT OTHERWISE WOULD BE PROVIDED BY A PUBLIC SCHOOL
EMPLOYEE SHALL REQUIRE THAT THE THIRD PARTY:

30(1) PROVIDE THE SAME WORKING CONDITIONS AND STANDARDS31THAT WOULD HAVE BEEN REQUIRED FOR A PUBLIC SCHOOL EMPLOYEE; AND

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#### 1 (2) PAY AT LEAST THE MINIMUM LIVING SALARY THAT THE PUBLIC 2 SCHOOL EMPLOYER WOULD HAVE BEEN REQUIRED TO PAY UNDER THIS SUBTITLE.

#### 4 NOTHING IN THIS SUBTITLE MAY BE CONSTRUED TO PROHIBIT A PUBLIC 5 SCHOOL EMPLOYER AND AN EXCLUSIVE REPRESENTATIVE FROM NEGOTIATING A 6 LIVING SALARY SCHEDULE THAT EXCEEDS THE REQUIREMENTS OF THIS SUBTITLE.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall be construed to
 apply only prospectively and may not be applied or interpreted to have any effect on or
 application to any existing collective bargaining agreements that were entered into before
 the effective date of this Act.

SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July
 1, 2018.
