A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Hunting – Required Outerwear – Daylight Fluorescent Pink**

3 FOR the purpose of adding daylight fluorescent pink as a color authorized for certain
4 outerwear required to be worn by certain persons performing certain hunting
5 activities; authorizing the Department of Natural Resources to adopt regulations to
6 define “daylight fluorescent pink”; and generally relating to the use of daylight
7 fluorescent pink outerwear while hunting.

13 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
14 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

15 **Article – Natural Resources**

16 10–418.

17 (a) This section does not apply to any person who:

18 (1) Hunts deer with a bow and arrow during the season restricted to
19 hunting with a bow and arrow;

20 (2) Hunts game birds or mammals during the open season using falcons,
21 hawks, or owls; or

1 (3) Hunts or accompanies, aids, or assists another person hunting the
2 following species:

3 (i) Wetland game birds;

4 (ii) Fur-bearing mammals;

5 (iii) Crows;

6 (iv) Doves; or

7 (v) Wild turkeys.

8 (b) Except as provided in subsection (a) of this section, a person who hunts any
9 wildlife and a person who accompanies, aids, or assists another person in a field, wooded
10 area, marsh, or on the water to hunt any wildlife shall wear:

11 (1) A cap of a solid daylight fluorescent orange **OR DAYLIGHT**
12 **FLUORESCENT PINK** color;

13 (2) A vest, jacket, or jacket containing back and front panels of at least 250
14 square inches of a solid daylight fluorescent orange **OR DAYLIGHT FLUORESCENT PINK**
15 color; or

16 (3) An outer garment of camouflage fluorescent orange **OR PINK** worn
17 above the waist which contains at least 50 percent daylight fluorescent orange **OR**
18 **DAYLIGHT FLUORESCENT PINK** color.

19 (c) By regulation, the Department may define the [term “daylight] **TERMS:**

20 (1) **“DAYLIGHT fluorescent orange”** consistent with the recommendations
21 of the North American Association of Hunter Safety Coordinators; **AND**

22 (2) **“DAYLIGHT FLUORESCENT PINK”**.

23 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July
24 1, 2018.
