4 FOR the purpose of ~~requiring each county board of education to report to the Maryland~~
5 ~~Department of Health the number of students who did not receive recommended~~
6 ~~services after failing a hearing or vision screening and the reason why certain~~
7 ~~students did not receive certain services; requiring each county board to develop a~~
8 ~~certain strategy to increase the number of students receiving recommended services~~
9 ~~after failing a hearing or vision screening; requiring the county board to report on its~~
10 ~~progress in meeting certain goals to the General Assembly each year; requiring the~~
11 Maryland Department of Health to review certain reports and, in certain counties,
12 to coordinate with the county board or the county health department to implement
13 measures to improve the number of students receiving certain services; and
14 generally relating to reports on hearing and vision screenings for students by county
15 boards of education.

21 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
22 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

2 7–404.

3 (a) (1) Each county board or county health department shall provide hearing
4 and vision screenings for all students in the public schools.

5 (2) Each county health department shall provide and fund hearing and
6 vision screenings for all students:

7 (i) In any private school that has received a certificate of approval
8 under § 2–206 of this article; and

9 (ii) In any nonpublic educational facility in this State approved as a
10 special education facility by the Department.

11 (b) (1) Unless evidence is presented that a student has been tested within the
12 past year, the screenings required under subsection (a) of this section shall be given in the
13 year that a student enters a school system, enters the first grade, and enters the eighth or
14 ninth grade.

15 (2) Further screening shall be done in accordance with:

16 (i) The bylaws adopted by the State Board; or

17 (ii) Policies adopted by a county board or a county health
18 department.

19 (c) The results of the hearing and vision screenings required by this section shall
20 be:

21 (1) Made a part of the permanent record file of each student;

22 (2) Given to the parents of any student who fails the screenings; and

23 (3) Reported to the county board or the county health department.

24 (d) On a form provided by the county board or the county health department, a
25 parent or guardian shall report to the county board or the county health department on the
26 recommended services received by a student who failed the screenings.

10 (II) IN COUNTIES WHERE FEWER THAN 50% OF STUDENTS WHO
11 HAVE FAILED THE SCREENINGS ARE RECEIVING THE RECOMMENDED SERVICES,
12 COORDINATE WITH THE COUNTY BOARD OR THE COUNTY HEALTH DEPARTMENT TO
13 IMPLEMENT MEASURES TO IMPROVE THE NUMBER OF STUDENTS RECEIVING THE
14 RECOMMENDED SERVICES.

22 ~~[(f)]~~ ~~(G)~~ In cooperation with the Maryland Department of Health, the
23 Department of Education shall adopt standards, rules, and regulations to carry out the
24 provisions of this section.

25 ~~[(g)]~~ ~~(H)~~ A student whose parent or guardian objects in writing to hearing and
26 vision screening on the ground that it conflicts with the tenets and practice of a recognized
27 church or religious denomination of which he is an adherent or member may not be required
28 to take these screenings.

29 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
30 October 1, 2018.
