2 Preamble

WHEREAS, The Board of Regents of the University System of Maryland and the Board of Governors of the Southern Maryland Higher Education Center have entered into an agreement to design and construct on the campus of the Southern Maryland Higher Education Center an 84,000–gross–square–foot education classroom and research facility that, under the auspices of the University System of Maryland, will attract and execute basic and applied research into the vitally important and growing field of unmanned and autonomous systems and technologies, as well as provide space for general and technical education and instruction to the residents and businesses of the Southern Maryland region; and

WHEREAS, University System of Maryland institutions have an established presence at the Southern Maryland Higher Education Center, with five universities offering degree programs, at both the graduate and undergraduate levels in engineering, information technology, K–12 education, nursing, criminal justice, and social work; and

WHEREAS, The Board of Governors and other stakeholders of the Southern Maryland Higher Education Center have engaged closely with the leadership of the University System of Maryland to develop a shared vision for a more fully integrated partnership combining the strength of the University System of Maryland's education, research, technology transfer, and student service programs with the strong array of advanced education and professional development services currently offered through the Southern Maryland Higher Education Center in order to address the workforce and economic needs and improve the quality of life enjoyed by the people and businesses of the Southern Maryland region; and

WHEREAS, To advance this shared vision, and create an unparalleled resource that promises to have a transformational impact on the further development of the advanced technology and innovation economy of the Southern Maryland region—and the concomitant highly skilled, highly educated workforce needed to drive such an economy—the Board of Governors of the Southern Maryland Higher Education Center and the University System of Maryland will soon have agreed through a memorandum of understanding to merge the Southern Maryland Higher Education Center and all its assets with the University System of Maryland to become the newest regional higher education center; now, therefore,

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:


Article – Education



- 1 (a) In this subtitle the following terms have the meanings indicated.
- 2 (b) "Board" means the Board of Governors of the Southern Maryland Higher 3 Education Center.
- 4 (c) "Center" means the Southern Maryland Higher Education Center.
- 5 (d) "Commission" means the Maryland Higher Education Commission.]
- 6 [24–302.
- 7 There is a Southern Maryland Higher Education Center that is governed by a Board 8 of Governors.]
- 9 [24–303.
- 10 (a) The Board consists of 13 voting members appointed by the Governor.
- 11 (b) The Governor shall appoint at least two members each from St. Mary's, 12 Charles, and Calvert counties.
- 13 (c) (1) Each member serves for a term of 4 years and until a successor is 14 appointed and qualifies.
- 15 (2) The terms of members are staggered as required by the terms provided 16 for members of the Board on July 1, 1994.
- 17 (3) A member may not serve more than two full consecutive terms.
- 18 (4) A member appointed to fill a vacancy in an unexpired term serves only 19 for the remainder of that term and until a successor is appointed and qualifies.
- 20 (d) (1) The Governor shall appoint one of the voting members to act as chair.
- 21 (2) The voting members may elect other officers and establish committees, 22 including advisory committees, as needed.
- 23 (e) In addition to the 13 voting members, the following individuals shall serve as 24 ex officio, nonvoting members:
- 25 (1) The commanding officer of the Naval Air Warfare Center Aircraft 26 Division at Patuxent River, or the commanding officer's designee;
- 27 (2) A member of the St. Mary's County Building Authority recommended 28 by the St. Mary's County Board of County Commissioners; and

- 1 A representative of the Tri-County Council for Southern Maryland. (3) 2 (f) Each member of the Board: 3 (1) Serves without compensation; and 4 (2) Is entitled to reimbursement for expenses in accordance with the Standard State Travel Regulations.1 5 6 [24–304. 7 In addition to the other powers expressly granted and duties imposed by this title, and subject to the authority of the Commission, the Board has only the powers and 8 9 duties set forth in this section. The Board shall: 10 (b) (1) Exercise general control over the Center; 11 12 (2) Keep separate records and minutes; and 13 Adopt reasonable rules, regulations, or bylaws to carry out the 14 provisions of this subtitle. The Board may fix the salaries and terms of employment of the Director and 15 (c) 16 other employees of the Center. 17 The Board may purchase, lease, or otherwise acquire any property it considers necessary for the operation of the Center, with the approval of the St. Mary's County Board 18 19 of County Commissioners. 20 The Board may sell, lease, or otherwise dispose of Center assets or property, with the approval of the St. Mary's County Board of County Commissioners. 2122 The Director of the Center or the chair of the Board may execute a conveyance or other legal document under an appropriate resolution of the Board. 2324(f) The Board shall ensure that all academic programs and policies of the Center are in compliance with the policies of and approved by the Commission. 25
- 26 (g) The Board shall submit an adopted mission statement to the Commission subject to the policies and guidelines of the Commission.
- 28 (h) The Board may enter into contracts or other agreements with any institution 29 of higher education for the provision of upper division undergraduate and graduate 30 programs to meet the higher education needs of Southern Maryland, subject to the approval 31 of the Commission.



- 24 (a) The Board shall appoint a Director of the Center.
- 25 (b) The Director shall:
- 26 (1) Report directly to the Board;
- 27 (2) Recommend the appointment by the Board of employees necessary for 28 the efficient administration of the Center;
- 29 (3) Recommend the discharge of employees for good cause and in accordance with applicable laws and policies;

- 2 (a) The Boards of County Commissioners of St. Mary's, Calvert, and Charles counties may appropriate money to pay the cost of establishing and operating the Center, including the establishment of a reserve fund for maintenance and repair.
- 5 (b) The expenditure of appropriated funds shall be consistent with all relevant 6 State laws.]
- 7 [24–308.
- 8 (a) If the Board of Governors of the Center conveys any real property in whole or 9 in part, the proceeds of the disposition shall be shared between St. Mary's County and the 10 State in such proportions as each has contributed to the capital investment in the property.
- 11 (b) That disposition shall be in accordance with all terms and conditions of the 12 original conveyance of the property to St. Mary's County Board of County Commissioners 13 and the Board of Public Works shall enter into an agreement providing for the calculation 14 of the amount due to each party under this section.
- 15 (c) The payment to the State shall be made by the county within 90 days of the date of receipt of any proceeds.]

- 18 (a) (1) The Board may carry comprehensive liability insurance to protect the 19 Board, its agents, and employees.
- 20 (2) The purchase of the insurance is for an educational purpose and is a valid educational expense.
- 22 (b) (1) The Board may adopt standards for the policies, including a minimum 23 liability coverage that may not be less than \$100,000 per occurrence.
- 24 (2) Any policy purchased after the adoption of these standards shall 25 conform to them.
- 26 (c) The Board complies with this section if it is self–insured, for at least \$100,000 and not more than \$500,000 per occurrence, under the rules and regulations of the State Insurance Commissioner.
- 29 (d) This section does not prevent the Board, on its own behalf, from raising the 30 defense of sovereign immunity to any amount of a claim in excess of the limit of an 31 insurance policy or in excess of \$100,000 in the case of self—insurance.]

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1	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the Southern Maryland
2	Higher Education Center, as set forth in Title 24, Subtitle 3 of the Education Article, will
3	cease to exist on the effective date of this Act and its operations, facilities, and resources
4	shall become part of a regional higher education center established by the Board of Regents
5	of the University System of Maryland in accordance with § 12-104(f) of the Education
6	Article.

7 SECTION 2. 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 8 October July 1, 2018.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That:

- 10 <u>(a) Section 1 of this Act is contingent on:</u>
- 11 (1) (i) the Chancellor of the University System of Maryland appointing 12 the University of Maryland, College Park Campus to oversee the administration and 13 research of the Southern Maryland Higher Education Center; and
- 14 <u>(ii) the Chancellor of the University System of Maryland soliciting</u>
 15 <u>advice from the University of Maryland, College Park Campus before the Chancellor</u>
 16 appoints an Executive Director of the Southern Maryland Higher Education Center; and
- 17 (2) the University System of Maryland and the Department of Budget and
 18 Management jointly submitting a report to the Senate Budget and Taxation Committee and
 19 the House Appropriations Committee on the capital needs of the Southern Maryland Higher
 20 Education Center.
- 21 (b) The University of Maryland, College Park Campus shall notify the Department 22 of Legislative Services within 5 days after the conditions described under subsection (a)(1) 23 of this section are met.
- 24 <u>(c) Section 1 of this Act may not take effect before all the conditions described</u> 25 <u>under subsection (a) of this section are satisfied.</u>
- 26 <u>SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, subject to Section 2 of this</u> 27 <u>Act, this Act shall take effect March 1, 2019.</u>
