BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments, Article – Natural Resources Section 4-1017 Annotated Code of Maryland (2012 Replacement Volume and 2017 Supplement) SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: **Article - Natural Resources** 4-1017. Unless a license first is obtained from the Department, a person may not (1) have a fixed place of business buying oysters and employing labor to prepare them for market, or (2) buy more than 25 bushels of oysters per year from persons who catch them from the natural oyster bars of the State. (b) The Department may not issue a license required by this section unless the

- (c) A person may possess oysters caught from the natural oyster bars of the State until one week past the close of the season for taking oysters as established in § 4–1008.1 of this subtitle. Oysters may be caught by dredge or handscrape at any time in Worcester County and may be shipped in the shell at any time within or from that county. In counties where oysters may be caught from leased areas at any time pursuant to the provisions of Subtitle 11A of this title, a person may possess oysters at any time.
- 8 (D) A SEAFOOD DEALER THAT USES A CONVEYOR TO LOAD OYSTERS FROM 9 A BOAT INTO A TRUCK MAY POSSESS UP TO 10% OYSTERS AND SHELLS THAT ARE 10 LESS THAN THE ALLOWABLE SIZE ESTABLISHED BY REGULATIONS OF THE 11 DEPARTMENT.
