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Public Safety - Trauma-Affected Veterans Training Program - Establishment

- 3 FOR the purpose of requiring the Department of Veterans Affairs, the Department of State 4 Police, and the State Traumatic Brain Injury Advisory Board jointly and in 5 consultation with veterans to establish a Trauma-Affected Veterans Training 6 Program to provide training to emergency responders and law enforcement officers 7 regarding the effects of certain injuries, techniques that can be used when 8 interacting with certain veterans, and any other relevant issues relating to certain 9 veterans; prohibiting training provided under the Program from being conducted through an online course; defining certain terms; and generally relating to a 10 Trauma-Affected Veterans Training Program. 11

- 1 (B) TRAINING PROVIDED UNDER THE PROGRAM MAY NOT BE CONDUCTED 2 THROUGH AN ONLINE COURSE.
