## A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Environmental Violations – Reporting Requirements**

3 FOR the purpose of requiring certain jurisdictions to report to the Department of the  
4 Environment on certain information relating to the number of cases alleging  
5 violations of certain laws, regulations, ordinances, and permits on or before a certain  
6 date each year; requiring the Department to report to the Governor and the General  
7 Assembly on or before a certain date each year; and generally relating to reporting  
8 requirements for environmental violations.

11 Section 4–801 to be under the new subtitle “Subtitle 8. Report on Environmental  
12 Violations”

15 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,  
16 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

17 **Article – Environment**

18 **SUBTITLE 8. REPORT ON ENVIRONMENTAL VIOLATIONS.**

19 **4–801.**

20 **(A) (1) ON OR BEFORE JANUARY 1 EACH YEAR, EACH JURISDICTION**  
21 **THAT HAS DELEGATED AUTHORITY UNDER SUBTITLE 4 OF THIS TITLE TO ENFORCE**  
22 **SEDIMENT AND EROSION CONTROL LAWS AND REGULATIONS SHALL REPORT TO THE**  
23 **DEPARTMENT ON:**

21 ALLEGED VIOLATION, INCLUDING THE FINAL DISPOSITION OF EACH COURT  
22 PROCEEDING;

23 (III) THE DOLLAR AMOUNT OF FINES LEVIED AND COLLECTED  
24 BY THE JURISDICTION AS A RESULT OF A VIOLATION;

25 (IV) THE DOLLAR AMOUNT OF CIVIL AND CRIMINAL PENALTIES  
26 IMPOSED AND COLLECTED AS A RESULT OF A VIOLATION;

13                   **(B) ON OR BEFORE MARCH 1 EACH YEAR, THE DEPARTMENT SHALL**  
14 **REPORT TO THE GOVERNOR AND, IN ACCORDANCE WITH § 2-1246 OF THE STATE**  
15 **GOVERNMENT ARTICLE, THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY ON THE INFORMATION**  
16 **COLLECTED UNDER SUBSECTION (A) OF THIS SECTION.**

17                   SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect  
18 October 1, 2018.
