Report on Environmental Violations" Annotated Code of Maryland (2013 Replacement Volume and 2017 Supplement) SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: Article - Environment SUBTITLE 8. REPORT ON ENVIRONMENTAL VIOLATIONS.
