Transit - Job Access and Reverse Commute (JARC) Program

3 FOR the purpose of establishing the Job Access and Reverse Commute Program in the 4 Maryland Transit Administration; authorizing the Administration to make certain 5 grants under the Program to certain providers for certain employment and 6 commuter projects; providing for certain administrative expenses; providing for the 7 distribution of funds under the Program; requiring the Administration to conduct 8 certain solicitations before accepting grant applications under the Program; 9 establishing a certain application process for a grant under the Program; 10 establishing certain standards for grants awarded under the Program; establishing 11 certain limitations on and a minimum duration of a grant for operating assistance; 12 providing for funding for the Program; requiring the Administration to conduct a 13 certain study on the Program and submit the study to the Governor and the General 14 Assembly on or before a certain date; defining certain terms; and generally relating 15 to the Job Access and Reverse Commute Program.

- 4 (B) A PROVIDER MAY USE NOT MORE THAN 10% OF THE AMOUNT 5 DISTRIBUTED TO THE PROVIDER UNDER THIS SUBTITLE FOR ADMINISTRATIVE 6 COSTS, AS DETERMINED BY THE ADMINISTRATION.
