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## Hospitals - Education - Child Safety Seat Requirements

3 FOR the purpose of requiring each hospital that provides services to a child under a certain age, at the time of discharge of the child, to provide and discuss with the parents of 4 5 the child or with the individual to whom the child is released certain information 6 relating to child safety seats, seat belts, and the transportation of children in rear 7 seats; providing that a hospital is not responsible for the failure of certain individuals 8 to whom a child is released to properly transport the child; defining certain terms; 9 and generally relating to the provision of information relating to child safety seat requirements by hospitals. 10

- 16 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
- 17 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 20 (A) (1) IN THIS SECTION THE FOLLOWING WORDS HAVE THE MEANINGS
- 21 INDICATED.
- 22 (2) "CHILD SAFETY SEAT" HAS THE MEANING STATED IN § 22–412.2
- 23 OF THE TRANSPORTATION ARTICLE.

- 1 (3) "SEAT BELT" HAS THE MEANING STATED IN § 22–412.3 OF THE 2 TRANSPORTATION ARTICLE.
- 3 (B) EACH HOSPITAL THAT PROVIDES SERVICES TO A CHILD UNDER THE AGE
  4 OF 8 YEARS SHALL, AT THE TIME OF DISCHARGE OF THE CHILD, PROVIDE TO AND
  5 DISCUSS WITH THE PARENT OF THE CHILD OR WITH THE INDIVIDUAL TO WHOM THE
- 6 CHILD IS RELEASED:
- 7 (1) Information regarding the requirements of §§ 22–412.2 8 AND 22–412.3 OF THE TRANSPORTATION ARTICLE RELATING TO CHILD SAFETY
- 9 SEATS, SEAT BELTS, AND THE TRANSPORTATION OF CHILDREN IN REAR SEATS; AND
- 10 (2) INFORMATION DIRECTING THE PARENT OR THE INDIVIDUAL TO WHOM THE CHILD IS RELEASED TO A WEBSITE OR OTHER SOURCE OF INFORMATION 12 THAT COULD PROVIDE:
- 13 (I) AT NO COST OR LOW COST, ADDITIONAL INFORMATION AND ASSISTANCE RELATING TO CHILD SAFETY SEAT REQUIREMENTS, INSTALLATION,
- 15 AND INSPECTION; AND
- 16 (II) INFORMATION ON THE AVAILABILITY OF LOANER OR RENTAL PROGRAMS FOR CHILD SAFETY SEATS THAT MAY BE AVAILABLE IN THE COMMUNITY WHERE THE CHILD RESIDES.
- 19 (C) A HOSPITAL IS NOT RESPONSIBLE FOR THE FAILURE OF A PARENT OR 20 ANY OTHER INDIVIDUAL TO WHOM A CHILD IS RELEASED TO PROPERLY TRANSPORT 21 THE CHILD.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2018.
