| 15 16 | SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: |

| 19 | (a) The Commission shall certify as a police officer each individual who: |
| 20 | (1) (i) satisfactorily meets the standards of the Commission; or |
| 21 | (ii) provides the Commission with sufficient evidence that the |

- 3 (2) submits to a psychological evaluation by a psychologist approved by the 4 Commission; [and]

7 (4) (I) IS A UNITED STATES CITIZEN; OR

- 8 (II) IS A PERMANENT LEGAL RESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES
 9 AND AN HONORABLY DISCHARGED VETERAN OF THE UNITED STATES ARMED

- 11 (b) The Commission may certify as a police officer an individual who is not considered a police officer under § 3–201(f)(3) of this subtitle if the individual meets the selection and training standards of the Commission.
- 14 (c) Each certificate issued to a police officer under this subtitle remains the 15 property of the Commission.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2018.
