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## 1 AN ACT concerning

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## Education – <del>Student Health Screenings – Brain Injury</del> <u>Identification of</u> <u>Students With Traumatic Brain Injury – Study and Report</u>

FOR the purpose of requiring county boards of education and county health departments to provide brain injury screenings to certain students; requiring county health departments to fund brain injury screenings for certain students; requiring that brain injury screenings be given to students in certain years; authorizing certain screenings in accordance with certain policies; requiring a county board or a county health department to report to the Maryland Department of Health the results of certain brain injury screenings and the number of students receiving certain services; requiring that a certain brain injury screening be developed by the Department, in consultation with the State Traumatic Brain Injury Advisory Board and include a certain minimum number of questions; and generally relating to student health screenings for brain injuries in schools requiring the Maryland Department of Health, the State Department of Education, and the State Traumatic Brain Injury Advisory Board jointly to study the under-identification of traumatic brain injuries among school-aged children and to recommend a process to identify certain children; requiring the Maryland Department of Health, the State Department of Education, and the State Traumatic Brain Injury Advisory Board to consult with interested stakeholders; requiring the Maryland Department of Health, the State Department of Education, and the State Traumatic Brain Injury Advisory Board to report their findings and recommendations to the Governor and the General Assembly on or before a certain date; providing for the termination of this Act; and generally relating to the identification of students with traumatic brain injuries.
