- 3 FOR the purpose of authorizing the Board of License Commissioners for Baltimore County 4 to allow a person to obtain a certain interest in one or more licenses issued in another 5 jurisdiction or state and a certain number of Class B beer, wine, and liquor licenses 6 that the Board issues; repealing a requirement requirements that a restaurant for 7 which a certain license is issued have a certain minimum dining seating capacity 8 and a certain cocktail lounge or bar seating capacity; altering the percentage of sales 9 in alcoholic beverages that a restaurant for which a certain license is issued is 10 required to have; requiring a restaurant for which a certain second or subsequent 11 license is issued to have a certain minimum capital investment for restaurant 12 facilities; altering the off-sale privileges of a certain license; and generally relating to Class B beer, wine, and liquor licenses issued in Baltimore County. 13

9 10 11	(1) IN ADDITION TO ONE OR MORE LICENSES ISSUED IN ANOTHER JURISDICTION OR STATE, not more than 12 Class B (on–sale — hotels and restaurants) beer, wine, and liquor licenses; or			
12 13 14 15	(2) if one of the restaurants for which a license is issued is located in the Liberty Road Commercial Revitalization District as defined by the County Council on October 18, 1999, not more than 13 Class B (on–sale — hotels and restaurants) beer, wine, and liquor licenses.			
16	(b) A restaurant described in subsection (a) of this section shall:			
17 18	(1) meet the requirements of the regulations of the Board regarding the availability and issuance of licenses;			
19 20	(2) meet the definition requirements of "restaurant" established under the regulations of the Board;			
21	(3) have a minimum dining seating capacity of 190 individuals;			
22 23	(4) [have a cocktail lounge or bar area seating capacity that does not exceed 25% of the dining seating capacity; and			
24 25	(5)] have not more than 40% 49% of sales in alcoholic beverages in connection with the business; AND
