## Education - Per Pupil Adequacy Target Grant - Established

3 FOR the purpose of establishing a Per Pupil Adequacy Target Grant to provide funds to county boards of education that meet certain criteria; stating the purpose of the 4 grant; requiring a certain grant amount to be provided to certain county boards 5 6 beginning in a certain fiscal year; requiring the Governor to include in the annual 7 budget bill a certain appropriation beginning in a certain fiscal year; requiring 8 certain county governments to provide certain appropriations in order for certain 9 county boards to be eligible to receive a certain grant; defining a certain term; and generally relating to the Per Pupil Adequacy Target Grant. 10

- 16 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
- 17 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 20 (A) IN THIS SECTION, "FULL-TIME EQUIVALENT ENROLLMENT" HAS THE 21 MEANING STATED IN § 5–202(A) OF THIS SUBTITLE.

- 1 (B) (1) THERE IS A PER PUPIL ADEQUACY TARGET GRANT TO PROVIDE 2 ADDITIONAL FUNDS TO AN ELIGIBLE SCHOOL SYSTEM THAT:
- 3 (I) WAS BELOW 80% OF THE ADEQUATE FUNDING TARGET AS
  4 MEASURED BY THE DEPARTMENT OF LEGISLATIVE SERVICES FOR FISCAL YEAR
  5 2015; AND
- 6 (II) HAS RECEIVED FROM THE COUNTY GOVERNMENT AN 7 APPROPRIATION THAT IS AT LEAST 2% GREATER THAN THE APPROPRIATION 8 REQUIRED UNDER § 5–202(D)(1)(II) OF THIS SUBTITLE IN THE FISCAL YEAR PRIOR 9 TO INITIALLY RECEIVING THE GRANT.
- 10 (2) THE PURPOSE OF THE GRANT IS FOR ELIGIBLE SCHOOL SYSTEMS
  11 TO REACH, IN FISCAL YEAR 2019, 87.9% OF THE ADEQUATE FUNDING TARGET AS
  12 MEASURED FOR FISCAL YEAR 2015.
- 13 (3) BEGINNING IN FISCAL YEAR 2019 AND FOR EACH FISCAL YEAR 14 THEREAFTER, THE GRANT AMOUNTS FOR AN ELIGIBLE SCHOOL SYSTEM SHALL BE 15 CALCULATED AS FOLLOWS:
- 16 (I) FOR CAROLINE COUNTY, \$1,665 MULTIPLIED BY THE FULL-TIME EQUIVALENT ENROLLMENT IN CAROLINE COUNTY USED TO CALCULATE THE FOUNDATION PROGRAM FUNDING FOR THE UPCOMING FISCAL YEAR;
- 19 (II) FOR PRINCE GEORGE'S COUNTY, \$2,310 MULTIPLIED BY
  20 THE FULL-TIME EQUIVALENT ENROLLMENT IN PRINCE GEORGE'S COUNTY USED TO
  21 CALCULATE THE FOUNDATION PROGRAM FUNDING FOR THE UPCOMING FISCAL
  22 YEAR; AND
- 23 (III) FOR WICOMICO COUNTY, \$1,298 MULTIPLIED BY THE 24 FULL-TIME EQUIVALENT ENROLLMENT IN WICOMICO COUNTY USED TO CALCULATE 25 THE FOUNDATION PROGRAM FUNDING FOR THE UPCOMING FISCAL YEAR.
- 26 (4) FOR FISCAL YEAR 2019 AND EACH FISCAL YEAR THEREAFTER, 27 THE GOVERNOR SHALL ANNUALLY APPROPRIATE IN THE BUDGET BILL THE GRANT 28 AMOUNTS REQUIRED UNDER THIS SECTION.
- (C) IN ORDER FOR A LOCAL SCHOOL SYSTEM TO REMAIN ELIGIBLE FOR A GRANT AFTER THE INITIAL YEAR OF RECEIPT, THE COUNTY GOVERNMENT MUST PROVIDE AT LEAST 2% MORE THAN THE REQUIRED APPROPRIATION UNDER § 5–202(D)(1)(II) OF THIS SUBTITLE IN EACH FISCAL YEAR PRIOR TO RECEIVING THE GRANT.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 2  $\,$  1, 2018.
