A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

Massage Therapists - Licenses and Registrations - Education and Display Requirements

4 FOR the purpose of altering the exemption from certain licensure and registration $\mathbf{5}$ requirements for certain students enrolled in an approved education program who 6 practice massage therapy; altering the educational requirements to qualify for a 7 license to practice massage therapy; altering the educational requirements to qualify 8 to be registered to practice massage therapy; requiring each holder of a license or 9 registration to practice massage therapy to display the license or registration and a certain renewal certificate in a certain location; defining certain terms; and generally 10 11 relating to the licensure and registration of massage therapists.

12 EACH HOLDER OF A LICENSE OR REGISTRATION TO PRACTICE MASSAGE 13 THERAPY SHALL DISPLAY THE LICENSE OR REGISTRATION AND ANY CURRENT 14 RENEWAL CERTIFICATE CONSPICUOUSLY IN THE OFFICE WHERE THE HOLDER IS 15 ENGAGED IN PRACTICE, INCLUDING ANY TEMPORARY PRACTICE LOCATION.

16 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 17 October 1, 2018.
