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## Task Force to Standardize Data Collection on Race and Ethnicity

1 recommendations to the Governor and, in accordance with § 2–1246 of the State 2 Government Article, the General Assembly.

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SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect on June 1, 2018. It shall remain effective for a period of 1 year and 1 month and, at the end of June 30, 2019, this Act, with no further action required by the General Assembly, shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
