AN ACT concerning

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Task Force to Standardize Justice Reinvestment Oversight Board – Data **Collection on Race and Ethnicity**

FOR the purpose of establishing the Task Force to Standardize Data Collection on Race 4 and Ethnicity: providing for the composition, chair, and staffing of the Task Force; $\mathbf{5}$ 6 prohibiting a member of the Task Force from receiving certain compensation, but authorizing the reimbursement of certain expenses; requiring the Task Force Justice 7 8 <u>Reinvestment Oversight Board</u> to study and make recommendations regarding 9 certain matters; authorizing the Board to delegate certain activities to a certain advisory board; requiring the Task Force Board to report its findings and 10 11 recommendations to the Governor and the General Assembly on or before a certain 12date; providing for the termination of this Act; and generally relating to the Task Force to Standardize Data Collection on Race and Ethnicity data collection on race 1314 and ethnicity.

It shall remain effective for a period of 1 year and 1 month 2 years 18 and, at the end of June 30, 2019 September 30, 2020, this Act, with no further action 19 required by the General Assembly, shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
