A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 Vehicle Laws – Registration Fee Exemption – Active Military and Veterans

- FOR the purpose of establishing an exemption from vehicle registration fees for a vehicle
 that is owned and personally used by a person who is serving in the armed forces or
 is a veteran and who relocates to and becomes a resident of the State for employment
 purposes; and generally relating to exemptions from the vehicle registration fee.

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article – Transportation

16 (a) The following vehicles are exempt from the registration fees specified in this 17 subtitle:

18 (1) A vehicle that is owned and operated by the United States, this State,
19 or any political subdivision of this State;

20 (2) A vehicle that is owned by a volunteer fire company incorporated in this 21 State or by a rescue squad and that is used for fire fighting or ambulance purposes;

(3) A canteen wagon of a recognized fire buff organization, as certified by
 the International Fire Buffs Association;

The central visual acuity is 20/200 or less in the better eye, 14with corrective glasses; or 2.There is a field defect in which the peripheral field has 1516contracted to such an extent that the widest diameter of visual field subtends an angular 17distance no greater than 20 degrees in the better eye; 18 (9)A vehicle owned and personally used by an individual who is at least 65 19 years old and is the surviving spouse of a deceased disabled veteran, as defined under § 7–208 of the Tax – Property Article; [and] 2021A Type I or Type II school vehicle owned and operated by a religious (10)22organization; AND 23(11) A VEHICLE THAT IS OWNED AND PERSONALLY USED BY A PERSON 24WHO: 25**(I)** IS SERVING IN THE ARMED FORCES OF THE UNITED STATES OR IS A VETERAN AS DEFINED IN § 9–901 OF THE STATE GOVERNMENT ARTICLE; 2627AND 28**(II) RELOCATES TO AND BECOMES A RESIDENT OF THE STATE** 29FOR EMPLOYMENT PURPOSES. SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 30 31October 1, 2018.

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
