A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

Election Law - Voter Registration Lists and Voter Registration Numbers (Voter Registration List Protection Act)

4 FOR the purpose of requiring that a copy of a list of registered voters be provided to a $\mathbf{5}$ political party established under certain provisions of law; altering the contents of a 6 certain statement; prohibiting a person from knowingly and willfully, rather than 7 only knowingly, allowing a list of registered voters under the person's control to be 8 used for any purpose not related to the electoral process; specifying that a certain 9 prohibition relates to allowing a list of registered voters to be used for any purpose not related to the electoral process in the State; prohibiting a person from knowingly 1011 and willfully allowing a list of registered voters to be made available or distributed. 12used for commercial solicitation, or published or republished in a certain manner; 13 establishing a certain penalty; altering the penalty for a certain violation; requiring 14 the State Board of Elections to adopt certain regulations; altering the definition of "personal information" for purposes of certain provisions of law governing the 1516protection of information by government agencies to exclude voter registration 17numbers; making this Act an emergency measure; and generally relating to voter 18 registration lists and voter registration numbers.

1 (b) (1) The State Administrator or a designee shall provide a copy of the 2 statewide voter registration list and voter registration records to a jury commissioner on 3 request and without charge by means agreed to with the Administrative Office of the 4 Courts.

5 (2) On application of the Attorney General, a circuit court may compel 6 compliance with paragraph (1) of this subsection.

7 (c) A person [who] MAY NOT knowingly [allows] AND WILLFULLY ALLOW a list 8 of registered voters, under the person's control, to be:

9 (1) used for any purpose not related to the electoral process [is guilty of a 10 misdemeanor and, on conviction, is subject to the penalties under Title 16 of this article] 11 IN THE STATE;

12 (2) MADE AVAILABLE OR DISTRIBUTED TO A THIRD PARTY OTHER 13 THAN A CANDIDATE OR BALLOT ISSUE COMMITTEE OR TO THE GENERAL PUBLIC;

14 (3) USED FOR COMMERCIAL SOLICITATION; OR

15(4) PUBLISHED OR REPUBLISHED IN A MANNER NOT AUTHORIZED16UNDER THIS SECTION.

17 (D) A PERSON WHO VIOLATES THIS SECTION IS GUILTY OF A MISDEMEANOR 18 AND, ON CONVICTION, IS SUBJECT TO THE PENALTIES UNDER § 16–101 OF THIS 19 ARTICLE.

20 (E) THE STATE BOARD SHALL ADOPT REGULATIONS TO IMPLEMENT THIS 21 SECTION.

24 (a) In this subtitle the following words have the meanings indicated.

25 (c) (1) "Personal information" means an individual's first name or first initial 26 and last name, personal mark, or unique biometric or genetic print or image, in combination 27 with one or more of the following data elements:

28 [(1)] (I) a Social Security number;

29 [(2)] (II) a driver's license number, state identification card number, or 30 other individual identification number issued by a unit;

1 [(3)] (III) a passport number or other identification number issued by the 2 United States government;

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[(4)] (IV) an Individual Taxpayer Identification Number; or

4 [(5)] (V) a financial or other account number, a credit card number, or a 5 debit card number that, in combination with any required security code, access code, or 6 password, would permit access to an individual's account.

7 (2) "PERSONAL INFORMATION" DOES NOT INCLUDE A VOTER 8 REGISTRATION NUMBER.

9 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act is an emergency 10 measure, is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health or safety, has 11 been passed by a yea and nay vote supported by three-fifths of all the members elected to 12 each of the two Houses of the General Assembly, and shall take effect from the date it is 13 enacted.
