Horse Racing – Maryland International and Preakness Stakes Incentives – Modifications

- FOR the purpose of altering the amount available for a purse for the Maryland 4 $\mathbf{5}$ International thoroughbred race; specifying that the Maryland International is a 6 graded stakes; authorizing, with the approval of the State Racing Commission, a 7 certain race; requiring that certain money distributed to the Racing Special Fund 8 and paid for certain purposes remain available for certain purposes; repealing 9 certain requirements that certain lottery revenues be deposited in the Racing Special 10 Fund; making a conforming change; providing for a delayed effective date for certain 11 provisions of this Act; and generally relating to the Maryland International 12thoroughbred race and Preakness Stakes.
