4 FOR the purpose of extending the termination date of the Senior Prescription Drug 5 Assistance Program; altering the period of time during which the subsidy required 6 under the Program may not exceed a certain amount; repealing the requirement that 7 the Program annually provide a certain subsidy of up to the full amount of the 8 Medicare Part D coverage gap; repealing certain provisions of law requiring and 9 governing the transfer of certain funds to the Senior Prescription Drug Assistance Program Fund by certain corporations under certain circumstances; making 10 11 conforming changes; providing for a delayed effective date for certain provisions of 12 this Act; and generally relating to the Senior Prescription Drug Assistance Program.
