Task Force and Pilot Program to Study the Integration of Unmanned Aircraft Systems Within State and Local Government Public Safety Operations

4 FOR the purpose of establishing the Task Force to Study the Integration of Unmanned 5 Aircraft Systems Within State and Local Government Public Safety Operations; 6 providing for the composition, chair, and staffing of the Task Force; prohibiting a 7 member of the Task Force from receiving certain compensation, but authorizing the reimbursement of certain expenses; requiring the Task Force to study certain 8 9 matters, establish a certain pilot program, and make recommendations regarding 10 certain matters; providing certain requirements for the pilot program; requiring the 11 Governor to include a certain appropriation in the annual budget bill for certain 12 fiscal years; requiring the Task Force to report its findings and recommendations to 13 the Governor and the General Assembly on or before a certain date; providing for the 14 termination of this Act; and generally relating to the Task Force to Study the 15 Integration of Unmanned Aircraft Systems Within State and Local Government 16 Public Safety Operations.

29 (3) IN OPERATING THE PILOT PROGRAM, THE TASK FORCE MAY NOT 30 INTERFERE WITH AN ACTIVE FIRE SUPPRESSION EFFORT UNLESS GRANTED 31 PERMISSION TO ASSIST IN THE EFFORT BY A SUPERVISING AGENCY WITH THE

1 AUTHORITY TO GRANT THE PERMISSION.

- 2 (4) UNMANNED AIRCRAFT SYSTEM OPERATORS MAY BE 3 COMPENSATED BY THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY AND CORRECTIONAL 4 SERVICES DURING TRAINING AND IN SUPPORT OF THE PILOT PROGRAM.
- 5 (5) FOR FISCAL YEARS 2020 AND 2021, EACH YEAR THE GOVERNOR

 11 ITS FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATIONS TO THE GOVERNOR AND, IN ACCORDANCE
 12 WITH § 2–1246 OF THE STATE GOVERNMENT ARTICLE, THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 2018. It shall remain effective for a period of 4 years and, at the end of June 30, 2022, this Act, with no further action required by the General Assembly, shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
