
A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 Task Force to Study the Baltimore Police Department

- 3 FOR the purpose of establishing the Task Force to Study the Baltimore Police Department; 4 providing for the composition, chair, and staffing of the Task Force; prohibiting a 5 member of the Task Force from receiving compensation, but authorizing the 6 reimbursement of certain expenses; requiring the Task Force to study and make 7 recommendations regarding certain matters; requiring the Task Force to report its 8 findings and recommendations to the Governor and the General Assembly on or 9 before a certain date; defining a certain term; providing for the termination of this 10 Act; and generally relating to the Task Force to Study the Baltimore Police 11 Department.
- 12 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, 13 That:
- 14 (a) In this section, "Department" means the Baltimore Police Department.
- 15 (b) There is a Task Force to Study the Baltimore Police Department.
- 16 (c) The Task Force consists of the following members:
- 17 (1) one member of the Senate of Maryland, appointed by the President of 18 the Senate:
- 19 (2) one member of the House of Delegates, appointed by the Speaker of the
- 20 House;
- 21 (3) the Secretary of State Police, or the Secretary's designee;
- 22 (4) one representative of the Maryland Chiefs of Police Association;

8 9 10	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 2018. It shall remain effective for a period of 1 year and, at the end of June 30, 2019, this Act, with no further action required by the General Assembly, shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
