Facilities shall review the changes to the membership and duties of the Oversight 1 2Committee enacted by this Act and, subject to § 2–1246 of the State Government Article, make recommendations on any additional legislative changes that may be necessary to the 3 4 Senate Finance Committee and the House Health and Government Operations Committee. SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That § 19–1409(b) of the Health – 5 General Article, as enacted by Section 1 of this Act, may not be construed to require the 6 7 resignation or replacement of any members currently serving on the Oversight Committee 8 on Quality of Care in Nursing Homes and Assisted Living Facilities solely on the basis of 9 who selected or appointed the individual to serve on the Oversight Committee. 10 SECTION 2. 4.
